# **Improvements**

## Changes for 2002 Season

Even as the sports calendar moved from a classic World Series into the soccer, football, hockey, and basketball seasons, your Media Little League Board was hard at work evaluating league operations, and making changes for the upcoming 2002 season. An eleven-man committee representing a diverse group of board members, chaired by Vice President Tony Antonello, met weekly in October and November, and spent nearly 300 man-hours of hard work preparing recommendations for improving Media Little League baseball. The set of recommendations prepared by the committee were presented to the Board members and the recommendations were approved at the December Board meeting. Highlights of the improvements include:

- Objectives for each of the 5 MLL Leagues A set of customized objectives were agreed to for each of our 5 leagues. These objectives contain themes of fun, safety, skills development, playing opportunities, varying levels of competitiveness, off-season play, and post-season play.
- 2. Player Development Our Directors of Baseball will create a unique skills development curriculum for each age group, and will work with league commissioners to implement the curriculum with the help of the managers, coaches (and parents!) of each team.
- 3. Post-Season Baseball Besides our participation in the 11-12 and 9-10 Year Old post-season tournament sponsored by Little League Baseball (Williamsport), MLL will encourage and support a significant level of post-season play for ages 8 through 12. Leave room on your June and July calendars!
- 5 Year Olds Starting this year, MLL will allow 5 year old players (age as of July 31, 2002) to sign up and participate in T-Ball.
- 5. <u>T-Ball League</u> After the first inning of each game, an organized skills development session will be conducted by the managers/coaches, before completing the game.
- 6. Continental League After the first inning of each game, an organized skills competition session will be conducted by the managers/coaches, before completing the game. The results of the skills competition will be used to keep official league standings. A one-day Skills Playoff will be conducted at the end of the season to determine which team wins the league championship.
- 7. Continental League The commissioner will organize an optional weekly baseball game, with National League playing rules (3 outs per inning; players pitch; etc.).

- 8. <u>National League</u> To encourage development, managers will be responsible to give each player an opportunity to play each position during the season. Additionally, every player must play an infield position for at least one inning in each game.
- 9. <u>American League</u> The American League will follow the same game rules as the Major League (most notable impact will be on base running related to stealing, wild pitches, and passed balls).
- 10. Major League The number of teams to be fielded will be determined with the intention of giving our 12 year olds a good opportunity to be drafted. It's possible that MLL will increase from 5 to 6 Major League teams for the 2002 season, which would require a player redistribution process that would be administered by the President, Player Agent, and Major League Commissioner.

# **Description of Our Leagues**

Media Little League operates under an annual charter from Little League International in Williamsport, PA, and is comprised of five leagues which serve approximately 500 youngsters from ages 6 to 12. The objective of MLL is to provide a safe, enjoyable environment for our children to learn the game of baseball, as well as the benefits of teamwork, sportsmanship, practice and competition. We make every effort to ensure that players are assigned to leagues best suited for their ability. Optimally, within the rules of Williamsport and varying sizes of registered age groups, we aim to provide the best environment possible for all of our youngsters. The five leagues within the MLL are:

#### **Major League**

This is the highest level of little league baseball, with teams comprised of youngsters primarily 11 and 12 years olds. On a highly limited basis, including a skill evaluation and specific parental consent, a small number of 10 year olds may be considered eligible to play on a Major League team. These teams are assembled using a confidential draft selection process, using "pooled" skill evaluations to maximize equality. Players remain on the same team from year to year, until their little league eligibility ends. There is a post-season MLL championship tournament.

## **American League**

This level is comprised of players primarily 10 - 12 years old. On a highly limited basis, including a skill evaluation and specific parental consent, a small number of 9 year olds may be considered eligible to play on an American League team. These teams are assembled using a confidential draft selection process, using "pooled" skill evaluations to maximize equality. Players do not remain on the same team from year to year. There are post-season MLL playoff games.

#### **National League**

This level is comprised of players primarily 9 years old. Based on the number of teams and registered players, the results of their prior year manager's evaluations, and their evaluation results, a sizable number of 8 year old players will also be assigned to this league. These teams are assembled using a confidential skill-based assignment process (not a draft by the managers). Players do not remain on the same team from year to year. Scores and records are kept. Due to players' ages, certain rules are modified to ensure safety and the highest level of play. There are post-season MLL playoff games.

#### **Continental League**

This level is primarily for 7 year olds with prior T-Ball experience and those 8 year olds not assigned to the National League. Rules are modified and coaches do the pitching in this league. Scores and records are not kept.

## T-Ball League

This level is primarily for players 5 and 6 years old and those 7 year olds without prior T-Ball experience. It is designed as their introduction to baseball. Scores and records are not kept.
